

Colonel John E. Turner last served as the Chief, Office of Defense Cooperation Support Division in the US European Command J5.

His previous assignments include Tank Platoon Leader, Scout Platoon Leader, and Troop Executive Officer in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Squadron, 7<sup>th</sup> Cavalry Regiment at Fort Stewart, Georgia and during the course of two deployments; one to Bosnia and one to Iraq. Following the Armor Captain's Career Course, COL Turner served as a Battalion plans officer in 1<sup>st</sup> Battalion, 13<sup>th</sup> Armored Regiment during a deployment to Iraq. He subsequently served as Company Commander in both the 3<sup>rd</sup> Brigade, 1<sup>st</sup> Armor Division and 1<sup>st</sup> Brigade, 1<sup>st</sup> Infantry Division at Fort Riley, Kansas.

Following command, COL Turner served as a planner at USINDOPACOM in Honolulu, HI; International Security Assistance Force (ISAF) in Kabul, Afghanistan, and USEUCOM in Stuttgart, Germany.

He holds a Masters of Military Arts and Sciences from the School of Advanced Military Studies, Command and General Staff College in Fort Leavenworth, Kansas.
